This March will mark the 12th anniversary of Crossing Borders. In looking back through the years, there are so many stories we could share with you, all because the Lord has been so faithful! We have been able to supply pastors, their families, and the needy in their communities with rice, beans, groceries, clothing, school supplies, Christmas presents, Bibles, Bible Study materials - and the list goes on.

When we began this ministry, our most fervent prayer was if we were to start this, we needed the Lord's assurance it would be on a continuous basis. We didn't want to start Crossing Borders and then months down the line tell the pastors we could no longer help them. The Lord answered by reminding us that HE was our Source and that he would honor our prayers as we trusted HIM. We stand amazed at His provisions, and at how He has done it through our supporters and friends all these years!

In 2001, I attended a leadership seminar where we worked out our own personal mission statement. Crossing Borders grew out of that statement, which is "to support, encourage and release *faith* in the needy and less fortunate." Someone said, "How do you release faith in people? Isn't that something that we just have?" My answer to that question is: as we support and encourage one another in our calling, doesn't that stir or release faith in others? Our faith is stirred when Harold Smith calls and says George Hughes is coming down with 10,000# of potatoes. Our faith is stirred when a group comes to help with maintenance on our church grounds. Our faith is stirred when groups come to work alongside the pastors to help with Bible schools. faith is stirred when we're able to walk through the valley of the shadow of death with the very people God has called us to minister to. "Stirred up" faith produces a release of faith in others!



He told His followers that her gift was more valuable to God because she had given her "all." The "widow's mite" is about heart-attitude. Elfi and I were called by God from different backgrounds. He assured us He was the God of all resources, and He was setting us on a path that only we could follow. We offered Him our respective careers and personal dreams in order to pursue HIS greater vision. And let me tell you, you can't outdream God, either! What moves Him motivates us, now. And you have each become part of that greater vision, too. Together we've been woven into something so much bigger than what any of us could make happen on our own!

When we began CBM, we could never have imagined the violence and lawlessness that has been happening here on the border, or the disasters that have struck our own country. One word that has resounded in my spirit for the past year is "REFUGE." Not only that we must look to the Lord as our Refuge, but that we, His people, are to create places of refuge for the hurting souls around

us. There are many organizations that do many good works, but the Master's plan has always been for His church to be the entity that demonstrates His love and compassion. Jesus said not to judge people (Matthew 7), because He will do that in those days that are coming (Matthew 24). When we love and care for people who can't pay us back, we have done it to the Lord Himself! We then truly become the blessing to others that He meant for us to be.

During a Tuesday morning service, I had this scripture "drop" in my lap: Jeremiah 31:2 says, "Those who survive the coming destruction will find blessings even in the barren land ..." I immediately thought of all of you who support, supply, and pray for this ministry. And I thought of our partners in Mexico, the pastors and churches, who we empower to bless people in the midst of a land made barren by violence. The Lord has used all of us to build a refuge-place called Crossing Borders

The Lord has said, "I will take care of My own." He sees what you have done for others, and He doesn't forget your heart of compassion. You may be in the midst of your own catastrophe right now.
